Reception, Where, where, where?

This week Reception have been learning all about position, direction and how to describe where things are. The children have been using lots of excellent language to use vocabulary such as beside, between and inside. We started off the week talking about simple directional language and the children enjoyed reviewing their prior learning and they programmed the Beebots and explained the directions. Then the children found the objects on their tick sheet in our Early Years' Garden and then had to describe where they were. The children worked as teams to use their mathematical language and we have so much fun searching and explaining.











Year 1 Plant Seeds!

This week, Year 1 have continued their plants learning. They recapped the knowledge of plant parts (root, stem and leaves) and learned that all plants grow from a seed. The class planted sunflower seeds in pairs and are excited to watch them grow.





Year 2 'Changing me'

Year 2 have begun their 'Changing Me' topic in PSHE this week, learning to recognise cycles of life in nature understand there are some changes that are outside their control and to recognise how they feel about this. Children chose one life cycle from the images and drew the egg/baby/seed/infant and how it changes to become an adult or fully grown. The children then labelled their pictures and wrote a sentence to describe the changes.








Year 3 Visit the Hancock Museum!

We labelled Hadrian's Wall and saw items that had been found by archaeologists at different Roman forts from the North East. We had the pleasure of learning more about what the romans did when they first landed in Britannia through a workshop. While at the museum we looked at some other exhibits that linked with our learning from previous topics in year 3 such as fossils and animals. Well done year 3!




Year 4 Show off their Writing Skills!




Year 5 Start their New Maths Topic
