
## Year 2


As part of their 'Animals Including Humans' Science topic, Year 2 have been learning all about the essential things that both animals and humans need to survive. We talked about the importance of food, water and air and that these are vital to our survival. We also discussed exercise, hygiene and diet as important factors of this. The children then made leaflets about an animal, informing their reader of what the animal needs to live healthily.



## Year 3

This week, in Topic, Year 3 have been learning about how Bronze Age communities changed over time. We discovered that this was the first time there were rich and poor groups of people. This was due to the discovery of bronze and the conflict over this. We also found that tribal leaders would wear bronze jewellery to signify their status.





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#### Year 4

As part of their Mountains and Rivers topic, Year 4 explored the different uses of rivers this week. We learnt how important rivers are and have been throughout history. We learned that rivers are used for settlements, transportation and provide important habitats to lots of animals including fish, birds and even hippos! We created our own leaflets explaining the different uses of rivers and produced some excellent work!







## Year 5

This week, Year 5 have continued their science topic of forces. We have focused our learning on gravity. We learnt that Sir Isaac Newton is a famous physicist, who discovered that when an unsupported object falls, the force acting upon the object is gravity. To investigate, we each made a paper helicopter. We then worked as a class to add a different number of paperclips to the helicopter to investigate the question – Does the number of paperclips added to a paper helicopter effect how quick it falls to the floor?







# **Year 6 Scientists Shine Bright!**

This week, Year 6 continued their learning into the fascinating world of electricity in their science lessons. They independently explored how voltage affects the brightness of a bulb in a circuit and they then came up with their own way of how to record the results. The excitement in the classroom was electric!







#### **Girls Football**

This week was an amazing week for Sacriston girls as they finished second in their league. It came down to the last week. After 6 games, Sacriston won four, drew one and ended with only one defeat. What an amazing few weeks and the girls were delighted with their medals.
